1. Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Submit an Application on Behalf of the City of Long Beach to the New York State Financial Restructuring Board (FRB) to Perform a Comprehensive Review of the City's Finances, Financial Practices and Operations.

Legislative Memo: The Financial Restructuring Board is a panel consisting of multiple elected and appointed state officials that issue findings and recommendations designed to improve the financial practices and overall finances of municipalities. Senator Todd Kaminsky has advised the City of the existence of the FRB, and its mission to help municipalities evaluate and rearrange their financial/operational practices. The City Council thanks Senator Kaminsky for advocating aggressively on behalf of Long Beach, and functioning as a liaison between governmental agencies.

Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Submit an Application on Behalf of the City of Long Beach to the New York State Financial Restructuring Board (FRB) to Perform a Comprehensive Review of the City's Finances, Financial Practices and Operations.

WHEREAS, Senator Todd Kaminsky has advised the City of the existence of the FRB, and its mission to help municipalities evaluate and rearrange their financial/operational practices, along with the potential financial assistance and incentives made available to participating municipalities; and

WHEREAS, Senator Kaminsky has advocated aggressively on behalf of the City, and functioned as a liaison between governmental agencies; and

WHEREAS, the FRB is a body consisting of multiple elected and appointed state officials that issue findings and recommendations designed to improve the financial practices and overall finances of municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the findings and recommendations of the FRB are not final and binding, unless the City formally agrees to abide by and implement such recommendations; and

WHEREAS, if the City agrees to adopt such findings and recommendations, the FRB may, in its discretion, award to the City up to five million dollars in loans and/or grants; and

WHEREAS, to help the City address its near and long term financial challenges, it is the desire of the City to submit an application to the FRB, forthwith;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Long Beach, New York that the City Council is in favor of filing an application on behalf of the City of Long Beach with the New York State Financial Restructuring Board, requesting that the FRB conduct a comprehensive review; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the City Manager is authorized and directed to submit said application and accompanying letter of concurrence upon adoption of this resolution.

CHAPTER II LAWS OF 2018

A LOCAL LAW

AMENDING SUBPART C OF RELATED ACTS RELATING  
TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH,  
RE: A LOCAL LAW TO OVERRRIDE THE TAX LEVY LIMIT  
ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW § 3-c.

BE IT ENACTED, by the City Council of the City of Long Beach, New York as  
follows:

Section 1. Subpart C of Related Local Laws relating to the Charter of the City of  
Long Beach, New York, enacted as Chapter 635 of the Laws of 1922, as heretofore amended,  
shall be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Article IX. Override of the Tax Levy Limit Established in General Municipal Law § 3-c.

Sec. 80. Legislative Intent.

It is the intent of this Local Law to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes  
that may be levied by the City of Long Beach, County of Nassau, pursuant to General Municipal  
Law § 3-c, and to allow the City of Long Beach to adopt a City budget for the Fiscal Year 2018-  
2019 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the “tax levy limit” as defined by General  
Municipal Law § 3-c.

Sec. 81. Authority.

This Local Law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of the General Municipal Law § 3-c,  
which expressly authorizes the City Council to override the tax levy limit by the adoption of a  
Local Law approved by vote of sixty percent (60%) of the City Council.

Sec. 82. Tax Levy Limit Override.

The City Council of the City of Long Beach, County of Nassau, is hereby authorized to  
adopt a budget for the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of  
the limit specified in General Municipal Law §3-c.

Sec. 83. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjusted by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.”

Sec. 2. This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon being filed in the Office of the New York Secretary of State.

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Long Beach, New York, that the  
City Clerk shall cause to be published in the official newspaper of the City of Long Beach the  
title, and a summary or the full text of said Ordinance; and be it further

RESOLVED, that said Ordinance shall be on the calendar for public hearing at a  
meeting of the City Council to be held at City Hall, 1 West Chester Street, Long Beach, New  
York, on June 5, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. on that day.

ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF ORDINANCES  
OF THE CITY OF LONG BEACH RE: GARBAGE AND REFUSE.

BE IT ENACTED, by the City Council of the City of Long Beach, New York, as follows:

Sec.1. Chapter 12, Article II, Division 1, Section 12-24(a) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Long Beach, as heretofore amended, shall be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

“Sec. 12-24. Sanitation charges for collection of garbage imposed on residential properties.

(a) The owner or owners of every parcel of real property in the city in which one (1) or more residential units is or are located shall pay to the city annually in advance one-half ( 1/2) on July 1 of each year, beginning **July 1, 2018**, and one-half ( 1/2) on January 1 of each year, beginning **January 1, 2019**, sanitation charges in the amount of **six hundred and five dollars (\$605.00)** for each residential unit contained in such parcel of property for the collection of garbage, paper and refuse from said premises.”

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.
