

EXECUTIVE ORDER

Number 32 of 2020

Local Emergency Order No. 32

DONNA M. GAYDEN, City Manager of the City of Long Beach, County of Nassau, State of New York, pursuant to the power vested in her by Section 20 of the Charter of the City of Long Beach and the laws of the State of New York do hereby order and declare as follows:

WHEREAS, Section 24 of the New York State Executive Law authorizes the chief executive officer of a city, pursuant to a declaration of a local state of emergency, to issue orders to preserve the public safety, well-being and health of such city in times of emergency; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach declared a local state of emergency on March 14, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 13, May 13, June 12, and July 13 of 2020, I extended the local state of emergency in accordance with Executive Law; and

WHEREAS, on May 23, 2020 by Local Emergency Order No. 10 in accordance with Section 24 of Article 2-B of the Executive Law and with the approval of the New York State Department of Health, the City opened the beach in accordance with the State's Interim Guidance for Lake and Ocean Beaches dated May 19, 2020 which set forth minimum State standards for the operation of all beaches; and

WHEREAS, since the beach opening and as a result of other beaches closing their gates when they reach capacity, the City has experienced an overflow and overcrowding of people at its beach and boardwalk throughout the day and well beyond normal hours of operation; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Executive Law § 24, I intend to modify Local Emergency Order No. 10 in order to mitigate such overcrowding; and


NOW, THEREFORE, be it

ORDERED, Local Emergency Order No. 10 is hereby amended as follows:

- The suspension of Section 18-30 of the Code of Ordinances is modified to permit non-resident day pass holders access to the beach Monday through Thursday only; and
- Section 18-32 is modified to prohibit individuals from entering or remaining on the Ocean Beach Park for any purpose between the hours of 8 p.m. and 5 a.m., except employees engaged in the operation of the park; and be it further

ORDERED, that this local emergency order shall be effective immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless extended, rescinded or modified in accordance with Executive Law § 24.
