

EXECUTIVE ORDER

Number 33 of 2020

Local Emergency Order No. 33

DONNA M. GAYDEN, City Manager of the City of Long Beach, County of Nassau, State of New York, pursuant to the power vested in her by Section 20 of the Charter of the City of Long Beach and the laws of the State of New York do hereby order and declare as follows:

WHEREAS, Section 24 of the New York State Executive Law authorizes the chief executive officer of a city, pursuant to a declaration of a local state of emergency, to issue orders to preserve the public safety, well-being and health of such city in times of emergency; and

WHEREAS, the City of Long Beach declared a local state of emergency on March 14, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 13, 2020, May 13, 2020, June 12, 2020 and July 13, 2020, I extended the local state of emergency and issued Local Emergency Order No. 1, closing the boardwalk of the City of Long Beach in accordance with Local Executive Law § 24; and

WHEREAS, Local Emergency Order No. 1, as well as the local state of emergency, have been extended multiple times in accordance with Executive Law § 24; and

WHEREAS, effective May 26, 2020, by Local Emergency Order Nos. 11, 15, and 22, the City re-opened the boardwalk; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Executive Law § 24, I intend to modify and amend Local Emergency Orders Nos. 11, 15, and 22; and

NOW, THEREFORE be it

ORDERED, that Local Emergency Orders Nos. 11, 15, and 22 are hereby modified and amended as follows:

- The boardwalk of the City of Long Beach will be open to the public from sunrise to 9 p.m. daily; and be it further

ORDERED, that this emergency order shall be effective immediately and shall remain in effect for five (5) days unless extended, rescinded or modified in accordance with Executive Law § 24 (2).
