I am pleased to announce that the City of Long Beach has been awarded \$50,000 in federal funding under the FY2021 Critical Infrastructure (CIGP) Grant Program. Funding for this initiative is provided by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSP) and is administered by the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services (DHSES). The performance period for this award is April 1, 2024, through August 31, 2025.

As outlined in your application, this funding is provided to mitigate vulnerabilities at your selected government owned critical infrastructure or mass gathering/special event site, as identified by a risk assessment, and to help your jurisdiction's first responder community prevent and protect against attacks on the identified site. Additionally, all capabilities developed through this federal FY2021 SHSP funding are required to be deployable regionally and nationally per the federal guidelines. All funding is subject to both New York State and federal guidelines and regulations.

Subject: Request for City Council Resolution – The “Walks” Water Main Replacement Project-Phase 1

Date: June 6, 2024

Please prepare a City Council Resolution authorizing the City Manager to enter into an agreement for the “Walks” Water Main Replacement Project Phase 1 with Thomas Novelli Contracting Inc. and D&B Engineering and Architects. The phase 1 project is the grid located between Park Avenue and Beech Street as well as New York Avenue to Grand Blvd.

The scope of the project includes the installation of new 8” diameter water mains on Olive and Walnut as well as new 6” diameter water main on the “Walks”. New 1” diameter copper services will be provided for each home in the project area.

New Permeable Pavers will be installed at each “Walk” and new 12’ high post top colonial poles with LED luminaires will be installed. The road will be milled and overlaid upon completion of the project.

The four bids received were:

- T. Novelli Contracting Inc.
41 Sarah Drive
Farmingdale, NY 11758..... \$4,798,500.00
- A.I.I. Allen Industries Inc..... \$8,585,400.00
- Bancker Construction..... \$8,758,850.00
- Araz Industries..... \$11,857,960.00

D&B Consulting Engineers and Architects, the City Consultant, checked the references of T. Novelli Contracting, Inc. and recommended (see attached letter) them accordingly. Additionally, T. Novelli Contracting has done numerous infrastructure projects in the City of Long Beach and has completed the on time and on budget.

Pursuant to Resolution 30/18 adopted March 20, 2018, the City entered into an agreement with D&B Engineers to provide design and construction administration services.

The original request for proposals incorporated construction inspection services. However, they were not awarded as part of resolution 30/18 adopted March 20, 2018 thus, we respectfully request authorization of \$368,662.00 to retain D&B Engineers and Architects for construction inspection services.

Please note the sum includes an additional \$47,413.00 increase their in construction administration services budget. The additional cost is to visit each property in the project area, meet with the respective residents, and prepare a sketch of each property depicting the proposed route of each new service.

Please be aware that partial funding for this project i.e. \$1,000,000.00 dollars is being derived from a grant from the US Environmental Protection Agency.

In summary the total resolution request is as follows:

- Thomas Novelli Contracting Corp. \$ 4,798,500.00
- D&B Engineers & Architects \$ 368,662.00
- \$ 5,167,162.00

Funds are available in:

- H2022-52296 \$ 730,472.67

An additional \$2,100,000.00 was approved in the 2024/2025 Capital Budget to cover the remaining balance of \$1,436,689.33
