MAGNOLIA PARK



Community Volunteers from the Long Beach community joined with the City of Long Beach, Surf For All, JetBlue, and KaBOOM! in the spring of 2013 to rebuild Magnolia Playground. In less than eight hours, volunteers built a child-designed playground that will serve thousands of children for years to come. The community designed park was funded by FEMA and KaBOOM!

SUMMER 2015

SKATE PARK



A state-of-the-art, community-designed facility for skateboarders will feature an amoeba bowl, a combination horseshoe bowl and mini-ramp, a speed hump and numerous handrails and stairs. It will be a roughly 15,000-square-foot L-shape, more than doubling the size of the old skate park. Paid for partially with FEMA funds.

IN THE WORKS

CLARK STREET SPLASH PARK



Renovations are currently underway in the back section of the park, and irrigation lines were recently installed. A community engagement session will be held in the coming weeks to obtain resident feedback regarding further renovations. The park will be partially funded by FEMA.

GEORGIA AVENUE SPLASH PARK



Councilman Eramo and DPW Commissioner LaCarrubba worked closely with the community and "Playground Systems" to develop the design and select equipment & benches. The safety surface was replaced and paid for by FEMA grant monies. The park reopened in early 2015.

SHERMAN BROWN PARK



A brand new safety surface and basketball court were installed in Sherman Brown Park, and the Park was officially opened in the summer of 2015. This community-designed park was fully funded by FEMA.

VETERANS MEMORIAL PARK



Basketball courts and the roller rink were replaced following Sandy with funding donated by Billy Crystal and Nancy Lieberman. The recreation turf field was repaired after Sandy as well. The children's playground will be adding a splash park component in the spring of 2016. These improvements are partially funded by FEMA.
