ROADWAY RESURFACING

Giving The Residents Of Long Beach Infrastructure They Can Be Proud Of

The City of Long Beach is pleased to announce the acceleration of roadway resurfacing in our community. The objective is to provide a smooth riding surface to improve road safety and traffic flow. The intent is to perform repairs to existing roadways, seal cracks, grind down the existing surface, and apply a maximum two inch overlay. It is essential that the asphalt be applied such that rain runoff will drain and ponding does not occur.

CRITERIA FOR ROAD CHOICE:



Roads must possess positive drainage.



Subsurface utilities in good working order.



Road resurfacing includes the milling off of top two inches of road and replacing with two inches of new asphalt. This adds between 10 and 15 years to the road's lifespan.

INVESTING IN OUR INFRASTRUCTURE


From 2012-Present, The City of Long Beach Department of Public Works has completed or allocated funding to more than 20 roadway projects, averaging approximately seven roadway projects per year. In comparison, from 2002-2011 (10 year period) the City completed only 22 roadway projects or approximately two per year.
