On Sunday, April 21, the City of Long Beach, in cooperation with the Town of Hempstead, will set up the annual collection site for the S.T.O.P. (Stop Throwing Out Pollutants) Program. S.T.O.P. collects harmful household products containing hazardous chemicals that can contaminate our waterways, groundwater and drinking water. The items will be disposed of in an environmentally safe manner.

The collection site will be located in the parking lot behind City Hall (1 West Chester Street) between the hours of 8:00am and 3:00pm. Vehicles may enter via Centre Street and follow signage to the drop off site to dispose of products listed below.
